

WILKS EUGENE HALE, JR (better known as Bill and Skipper) went home to be with his gracious Lord January 15, 2021.

Bill was born in Dayton, Ohio August 25, 1943. His parents moved to Miami, Florida when Bill was just 3 months old. Even though he was raised in Florida, Jo never let him get away with calling himself a cracker. It became a common joke between them and he would make a point of telling anyone he met that Jo wouldn't let him claim that privileged status because he wasn't born here.

After making a perfect score on the entrance exam, Bill enlisted in the U.S. Air Force in 1963. He served in payroll and finance. He was sent to Vietnam and served in the same capacity there. He was honourably discharged from the Air Force in 1967. In 1973, Bill decided to re-enter military service, choosing this time to join the U.S. Navy. He was very interested in electronics, so he chose to train to become a submarine sailor. He easily qualified, ranking fourth in his submarine school classes. He served on a submarine for a few years as a Ship's Inertial Navigation Systems (SINS) technician. He then transferred to a Submarine Tender Ship where he served for a few years. His last transfer was to the Naval Ordnance Test Unit in Cape Canaveral where he served until his retirement in 1990.

After his retirement from the Navy, Bill moved to Lehigh Acres immediately to care for his ailing mother until she passed in 1991. He decided then to make Lehigh Acres his permanent home. After taking a much-needed break from employment, Bill applied for an electronics technician position with Lee County Department of Transportation: Tolls Division. He was hired in May of 1996 and retired in March of 2016.

In August of 1992, Bill became reacquainted with an old friend named Jo Ann. When he would tell the story, he always said it with such pride like this: "She hunted me down like a dog." This meeting, they both realized eventually, was planned by God because it started Bill on his journey to having a powerful encounter with Jesus and his life was forever changed. They married in 1997 and would have been married 24 years May 10th, 2021.

Bill was preceded in death by his father, Wilks Eugene Hale, Sr and his mother, Patricia Hale.

He is survived by his wife, Jo Ann. They are members of Providence and have been attending since the church was planted in Lehigh in 2010.

He is also survived by two sons, Wilks Edward (Ed) and wife, Nahal Hale of Brooklyn, NY and John Francis and wife, Tiffany Hale and two granddaughters, Allie and Alyssa of Fulshear, TX.

4. A review of your dedicated service to the Navy and to the country portrays your unrelenting support of the Navy's goals and ideals. It gives me great pleasure to express the Navy's appreciation for your many years of faithful and honorable service. On behalf of the President, Secretary of Defense, Secretary of the Navy, Chief of Naval Operations, and the officers and men of Naval Ordnance Test Unit, I wish you Godspeed and continued success in future endeavors.
