If it is the Mosman I knew he did retire to Simi Valley upon leaving the Navy. His middle name was also Wayne. I cannot be 100% sure but it is very likely this is the chief I worked for in the Weapons Department during new construction and commissioning of the Henry L. Stimson.

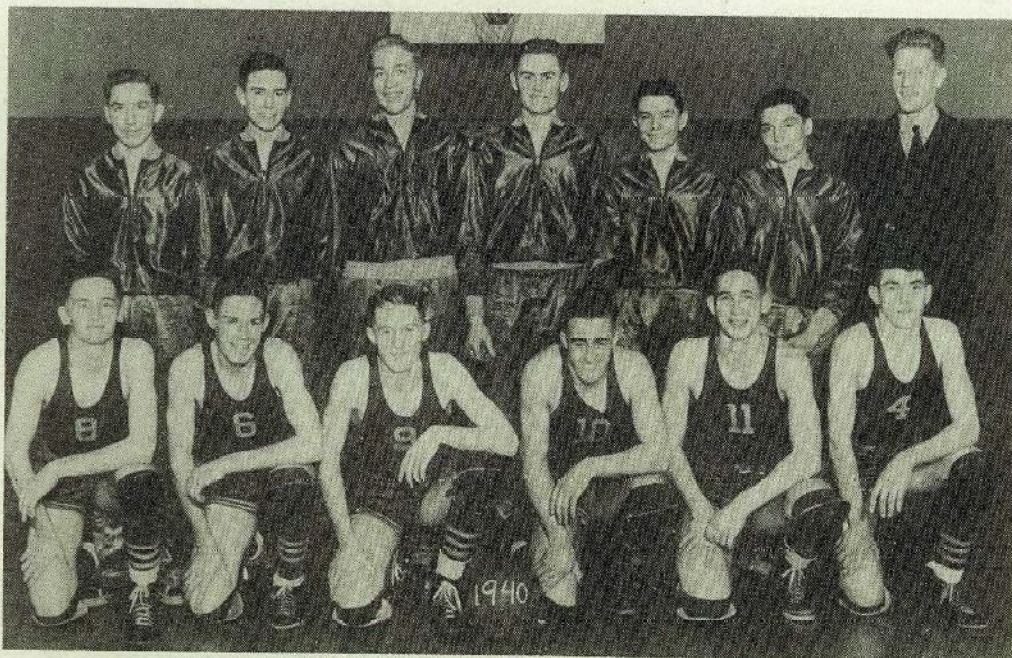
